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
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Charging the Battery Pack

The camcorder can be powered with a battery pack or directly using the compact power adapter. When you use the compact power adapter, the power of the battery pack will not be consumed. Charge the battery pack before use.










- Attach the ferrite core to the compact power adapter cable.
 - 1) Attach the ferrite core about 6 cm (2.4 in.) from the plug end (the plug to be connected to the camcorder).
 - 2 Pass the cable through the center of the core and wrap it around the core (as shown in the illustration), then close the unit until it clicks shut.
 - Attaching the ferrite core to the compact power adapter cable is necessary to suppress RF interference.
- Connect the compact power adapter.
 - Connect to the adapter.
 - (2) Plug into a power outlet.
- Connect the camcorder. Plug into the DC IN terminal.
- Insert the battery pack.
 - 1) Press softly into the battery attachment unit.
 - (2) Slide up until it clicks in place.

Charging will start when the camcorder is turned off.



Charging times

Charging the supplied BP-820 Battery Pack will take approximately 4 hours 35 minutes. A fully charged battery pack will allow for 1 hour 40 minutes of recording under typical conditions or 4 hours 35 minutes of playback.*

* For movies recorded at 17 Mbps. Given times are approximate and vary according to recording mode and charging, recording or playback conditions.

IMPORTANT

- When using the AC adapter, do not fix it permanently to one place as this may cause a malfunction.
- Do not connect to the camcorder's DC IN terminal or to the compact power adapter any electrical equipment that is not expressly recommended for use with this camcorder.
- To prevent equipment breakdowns and excessive heating, do not connect the supplied compact power adapter to voltage converters for overseas travels or special power sources such as those on aircraft and ships, DC-AC inverters, etc.


- We recommend charging the battery pack in temperatures between 10 °C and 30 °C (50 °F and 86 °F). If either the ambient temperature or the battery pack's temperature is outside the range of approx. 0 °C to 40 °C (32 °F to 104 °F), charging will not start.
- The battery pack will be charged only when the camcorder is off.
- If remaining battery time is an issue, you can power the camcorder using the compact power adapter so the battery pack will not be consumed.
- Charged battery packs continue to discharge naturally. Therefore, charge them on the day of use, or the day before, to ensure a full charge.
- We recommend that you prepare battery packs to last 2 to 3 times longer than you think you might need.
- USA and Canada only: The Lithium ion/polymer battery that powers the product is recyclable. Please call 1-800-8-BATTERY for information on how to recycle this battery.

Basic Preparations

Before you begin, make basic adjustments and learn about a few of the frequently-used parts. See Preparing the Camcorder (PDF) 21) for details. See Handling Precautions (PDF) 167), Cleaning (PDF) 171) for important information about how to take care of the touch screen.






Remove the lens cap and then attach the lens hood.

Place the lens hood on the front of the lens so that the groove on the lens hood is aligned with the bottom of the lens (①), and then turn the lens hood clockwise (②).

- Be careful not to deform the lens hood.
- Make sure that the lens hood is aligned with the thread.
- To remove the lens hood, turn it counterclockwise.








Adjust it so you can reach the zoom rocker with your index finger, and START/STOP) with your thumb.



Open the OLED panel and adjust the angle.

- Rotate it up to 90 degrees down (for example, to record with your hand extended above a crowd).
 - ② Rotate it up to 180 degrees toward the lens (for example, to record video of yourself).
 - ③ If it is difficult to use the OLED screen, you can use the viewfinder, which can be tilted 45 degrees upward.




Become familiar with the touch screen.

In addition to touching buttons to select items, you can also drag your finger across the screen for operations such as scrolling menus. While touching the screen, swipe your finger across the screen.

step 3 Using a Memory Card

Use commercially available SS SD, SS SDHC (SD High Capacity) or SS SDXC (SD eXtended Capacity) memory cards. Make sure you use a compatible memory card. See Memory Cards Compatible for Use with the Camcorder (SPDF) 32) for memory cards that can be used.



Turn off the camcorder.

Set to OFF. Make sure the indicator is off.

Open the double memory card slot cover.

- 3 Insert the memory card into one of the memory card slots and close the double memory card slot cover.
 - 1 Push the memory card into the memory card slot.
 - ② Securely close the cover. Do not force it closed if the memory card is not correctly inserted.



IMPORTANT

- Memory cards have front and back sides that are not interchangeable. Inserting a memory card facing the wrong direction can cause a malfunction of the camcorder.



Setting the Date/Time and Language

When you turn on the camcorder for the first time, you will need to set the date and time before using the camcorder. You can also change the date format and time zone. (For your convenience, you can do so after changing the language to your preference.)





Shooting Video and Taking Photos

In AUTO mode you can easily record movies and photos. You do not need to worry about any settings or menu options - the camcorder will select the most appropriate settings automatically.




- Start recording movies.
 - Press to start recording. Press again to pause the recording and record the video on the memory card as one scene.
- Take a photo.
 Touch [PHOTO] on the screen.

Using the Zoom to Frame the Subject

Use the zoom rocker or the onscreen zoom controls. To zoom out, zoom toward the \boldsymbol{W} (wide angle) end. To zoom in, zoom toward the \boldsymbol{T} (telephoto) end.

Selecting Video Recording Options

You can record movies in either AVCHD or MP4 format. Select AVCHD when you want to play back your movies with fantastic picture quality. Select MP4 when you want the versatility of uploading your movies to the Web or playing them back on devices such as smartphones and tablets.


About the zoom speed:

- Onscreen zoom controls: depends on where you touch within the zoom control.
- Zoom rocker: variable speed. That is, the zoom speed depends on how you press the rocker: press gently
 for slower zooms; press harder for faster zooms. You can also change the zoom speed to one of three
 constant speeds.





Playing Back Movies and Viewing Photos

Your recordings are conveniently organized in different index screens for AVCHD movies, MP4 movies and photos. You can change the index screen and easily find the recording you want to play back.

Change the index screen, if necessary.

Movies: Touch the index screen button ([A MGD]) to open the index selection screen. Next, touch the tab that indicates the memory card with the desired scene (A or B) and then touch the control button of the desired index screen.






- Look for the scene or photo you want to play back.
 - Drag your finger left or right for the next/previous index page.
 - ☐: Icon indicating a scene recorded using the [Image Effects] > [Looks] > [Highlight Priority] look.



Touch the desired scene or photo to play back.

Movies: The selected scene is played back. Playback continues until the end of the last scene in the index screen. Touch the screen during playback to display the playback controls.



- 1) Touch anywhere else to hide the playback controls
- ② Next scene
- ③ Fast playback* (touch again to increase the speed)
- (4) Stop
- (5) Volume controls
- (6) Pause (touch again to resume playback)
- (7) Beginning of the scene (double-tap to jump to the previous scene)
- $^{\star}\,$ In playback pause, these controls are replaced by the slow playback controls.

Photos: The selected photo is displayed in single photo view. Drag your finger left/right to browse through the photos one by one. Touch the screen to display the playback controls.

Using Wi-Fi to View Recordings

You can wirelessly upload recordings to an iOS device or Android device, view recordings from the Web browser of your smartphone or tablet, and more.

• You may not be able to play back with another device the movies you recorded on the memory card with this camcorder. In such case, play back the movies on the memory card using this camcorder.

i NOTES

 When playing back movies, depending on the recording conditions, you may notice brief stops in video or sound playback between scenes.

basic playback

Playback on a TV Screen

Connect your camcorder to a TV to enjoy your recordings with family and friends. Make sure the camcorder and TV are turned off before you start.




Connect the camcorder to the TV.

Select the appropriate connection according to the input terminals on your TV. The HDMI connection has higher picture quality (HD) than the composite video connection (SD).

Turn on the TV and then the camcorder.

Play back your movies or photos as described in the previous pages.



(i) NOTES

- The illustrations are for reference only. The layout of terminals on your TV may be different.
- We recommend powering the camcorder using the compact power adapter.
- The HDMI OUT terminal on the camcorder is for output only. Do not connect it to an HDMI output terminal on an external device, as this may damage the camcorder.
- Adjust the volume using the TV.
- When you play back 16:9 movies on standard TV sets with a 4:3 aspect ratio, the TV set will switch
 automatically to widescreen mode if it is compatible with the Video ID-1 system. Otherwise, change the
 aspect ratio of the TV manually.

defective Video Head, which will be exchanged for a period of three months from the date of purchase.

Labor: For a period of ONE YEAR from the date of original purchase, labor will be provided free of charge by our factory service centers or designated service

facilities located in the United States.

When returning Equipment under this warranty, you must pre-pay the shipping charges, and you must enclose the Bill of Sale or other proof of purchase with a complete explanation of the problem. During the ONE-YEAR warranty period, repairs will be made and the Equipment will be return-shipped to you free of charge.
